Maintenance

- Smoke Alarms Residents are required to test all smoke alarms twice a year (we recommend when daylight savings time changes) to make sure they are working properly. Residents are responsible for buying and replacing the batteries right away when needed.
- Air Filters Please ensure that your air filter in your furnace is replaced regularly (every 3-4 months is recommended). Stop by the office to pick up a free air filter when you are ready to replace them. It's a good idea to dust or vacuum your furnace intake vent, which is the large square vent in your ceiling or wall, that collects a lot of dust.
- Water Filters Replace your fridge's water filter when the filter light on your fridge alerts you to change it. Residents are responsible to buy and replace their own water filters. The serial and model number is on the filter. You can get them at any hardware store or online.
- **Watering Lawns** Residents are responsible for watering their backyards.
- Mowing Lawns Residents are responsible for mowing their backyards, keeping trees and bushes trimmed in the backyard, filling in holes and reseeding or sodding bald spots.

Friendly Reminders

- Trash & Recycle Ensure your bins are out on the curb by 6am the day of pick-up or the night before pick-up day. Make sure bins are not overflowing and the lid can be closed. Residents with overflowing bins and extra trash next to bins will be charged for extra trash.
- Pools/Bounce Houses/Trampolines NO swimming pools or hot tubs are allowed on property. Wading pools under 12 inches deep are allowed and must be emptied daily and not left on the grass. Wading pools are only allowed in the back-yard. Bounce houses are also allowed, but only if used in the backyard, and they must be taken down and put away on a daily basis. Trampolines are NOT permitted without permission from the neighborhood management office.
- RVs/Camping Trailers/Utility Trailers/Boats -Recreational vehicles (campers, trailers, boats, etc.) are not permitted to be parked in the neighborhood at any time; however, such vehicles may be parked within the confines of your garage. You are allowed to load and unload them in the confines of your driveway in a timely manner, but they are not allowed to be parked in your driveway or the street overnight.
- Street Parking Please ensure all your parking spaces in your garage and driveway are used before parking on the street. Street parking should be reserved for guests, delivery drivers, moving vehicles and emergency vehicles. And please refrain from tandem parking, where one car parks on the street directly across from another car on the street. This makes it difficult for oversized vehicles to get down the street.

Cooling Homes

- Keep blinds and curtains closed during the day (Purchase black-out curtains if possible) (Foil is not permitted)
- Use a portable air conditioner (Window units are not permitted)
- Keep entry doors closed during the day
- Close interior doors to rooms and closets that do not need cooling
- Set your ceiling fans to turn counter-clockwise, there's a switch above the light to change the direction
- Heat rises. In 2-story homes if upstairs is too hot move to the ground floor.
- If your home is too hot, head to somewhere cooler: the lake, a store, the mall, or even come hang out at the community center.

Emergencies that are a potential threat to life, health and safety need to be called in to the Maintenance line.


Summer Reminders

- Please test waters before jumping into them.
 Bodies of water stay colder for longer in the PNW.
 It might be 75 degrees outside, but the waters
 could be 40 degrees still. Jumping into them can
 cause even the most skilled swimmer to go into
 shock and drown. Please be cautious!
- Make sure younger residents have life jackets before heading to the lake. Davies Beach in Lake Stevens has a place to pick up free life jackets.
- Make sure to drink plenty of water and wear sunscreen.
- Do not leave young residents and pets unattended outside, in garages or areas without air circulation, or in cars.

Pet Policy Reminders

- No pets are allowed at the Residents' homes without the prior written consent of the Owner.
- There is a limit of two pets per household.
- Pets must be housebroken, litter trained, or cage trained and Residents shall not permit the pet to cause any damage, discomfort, annoyance, nuisance or in any other way to inconvenience or cause complaints from any other Resident(s).
- Resident is responsible for removing pet waste promptly from the exterior and interior of the home and the Neighborhood common areas.
- Any pet that bites a human or other pet, regardless of circumstances, is not eligible to reside here and must be immediately removed from the Premises.




